### **Into the Fray**

Between 1914 and 1918, the Great War raged causing an unprecedented loss of life that reverberated back into every society involved. For Canada, the loss of young men to industrial war brought deep mourning to most communities. At exactly the same time, Canadians braced for modernity – a modernity in large part created by enduring the Great War.

Kamloops, a small city on the fringes of a young Canada, was tied to Great Britain by bonds of sentiment, a shared history, and a sense of duty. Many young men and women volunteered for service, some with an eye toward adventure, but unaware of the harrowing experiences of conflict and how months would turn into years.

Into the Fray explores this extraordinary moment of sacrifice through the eyes of the Kamloops community and the individuals who experienced the war first-hand. Not all were lucky, not all would return. Their experiences reflect the darkness of war and the brightest hopes for the future. In the end, the legacy of the Great War was both monumental loss and the emergence of the modern world.
